Governor Smith stated that the two sessions that he participated in (Liability and Accountability and CAAT Pension Plan) were very informative and he highly recommended future participation by other governors. The webinar option facilitated participation.	
	The January 21 st Alumni Spaghetti Dinner was a success and was well attended. President Piercy was guest speaker for the evening.

	President Piercy reported on the following:	
	President Piercy commented on the difficult circumstances that our communities have recently experienced and extended deepest sympathies to the families of Jessica Lloyd – a

graduate of the College – and Corporal Marie-France Corneau, for their tragic loss.	
President Piercy reiterate the importance (especially now) of showing ongoing support and appreciation of CFB 8 Wing Trenton military members and their families, and of all Canadian military personnel in the incredibly important work that they do on behalf of us all.	
President Piercy commented on the unofficial results of the February 10th faculty vote on the final offer from the college's management bargaining team. A 51% majority of faculty in the 24 Ontario Colleges accepted the colleges' final offer. The official final vote will be determined after a review of all the ballots, including segregated ballots and mail-in ballots, by the Ontario Labour Relations Board (OLRB). President Piercy reported that colleges across the system plan to operate as usual until the final results are known.	
As a Health and Safety and Emergency Response education session, Fire Chief Rhéaume Chaput and Senior First Prevention Officer, Dave MacMullen visited the campus on February 1st to present the 'Knowfire' fire safety and awareness campaign. This program was developed specifically for university and college campuses.	
The College's 14 th Annual Career Fair was held on February 14th and was deemed a great success. More than 70 employers participated.	
The Junior Iron Chef Competition and Food and Beverage Show will be held on Saturday, Feb. 20th from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m. Seven teams from area high schools participated in the semi final competition with teams from Loyalist Collegiate Vocational Institute from Kingston; Holy Trinity Catholic Secondary School from Courtice, and Picton's Prince Edward Collegiate Institute reaching the finals. All events are open to the public.	
A January 12th OYAP Orientation - Parent Information Night was a collaborative effort between the Hastings and Prince Edward District, the Algonquin Lakeshore Catholic and Kawartha Pine Ridge District school boards, the OYAP Steering Committee and Loyalist faculty from the Automotive, Culinary and Early Childhood Education programs. More than 100 attended the information evening which was held at the College.	
SETUP - Science Engineering Technology Ultimate Pathways – a partnership between the College, area Boards of Education and community sponsors will be held at the College on March 2nd and 3rd. This School-College-Work initiative is organized to introduce women to the fields of science, engineering and technology.

	Applications to full-time fall programs at Ontario colleges have increased 14% this year, significantly higher than the 2.7% increase reported by universities. Loyalist's applications are up 14% over the same time last year.	
	The outpouring of support for Haiti Relief from the College Community has been heart warming with a number of fundraising projects organized.	
	Congratulations were extended to Governor Smith, in his role as Board Chair of Quinte Health Care, and to all who were involved in the planning and implementation of the Sills Wing at Quinte Health Care, which recently was celebrated in a Grand Opening.
