	Chair Werkhoven reported on the May 6 <sup>th</sup> visit by President Piercy and her to Queen's Park. The day included observing Question Period in the House, lunch with Lou Rinaldi, MPP Northumberland-Quinte West and a private tour of Queen's Park. The day was an excellent advocacy opportunity.	
	> The College's 43rd Convocation Ceremonies are fast approaching and plans are taking shape to welcome students, their families and friends and our guest speakers to the June 10th and 11th ceremonies.	
	Governors will soon receive an information package confirming the Convocation Ceremony that they have indicated they will attend, as well as an outline of their platform duties.	
	➤ The Annual General Meeting of the Loyalist College Foundation will be held on Thursday, May 27 <sup>th</sup> at 5:15 p.m. in the College Board Room. All Board members are welcome.	
	➤ With the golf season upon us, golfers and non-golfers were reminded that registrations are being accepted for the 12th Annual Loyalist College Golf Tournament which is scheduled for Friday, September 17th at Trillium Wood Golf Course. Net proceeds from this event are doubled through the provincial government's OTSS program, and provide financial assistance to Loyalist students.	
	An Election of Officers will be held at the June 3rd Board meeting. 11.	PRESIDENT'S REPORT	
	President Piercy reported on the following:	
	➤ Loyalist Paramedic Students placed third in the National Paramedic Competition at Durham College on April 10 <sup>th</sup> . This is the eighth annual competition and Loyalist teams have placed in one or more of the top three spots every year.	
	Construction of the new Student Residence for returning students has begun. Some of the units will be ready for September 2010 with the remaining units being completed for September 2011. Construction of the Skills Centre is going well and is on target.	
	➤ Spring 2010 enrolment for Continuing Education activities is strong with April 29 <sup>th</sup> numbers showing enrolment at 10,632 – an increase of 15% over this time last year.	
	> The April 29 <sup>th</sup> announcement from MPP Leona Dombrowsky regarding the \$66,000 awarded to the College to support improvements to space and resources which the College is able to provide for aboriginal students was welcome news.	
	➤ In March, the Loyalist College Virtual World Design Centre participated in the Federal Virtual Worlds Challenge at the Gametech conference in Orlando, Florida, and placed second in the Skill Building division for our Border Crossing Simulation. It makes us proud to see the excellent calibre of the work being recognized at this high level and in such competitive company. The recipient of first place was a team out of NASA!	
	A number of School-College-Work Initiatives have taken place in the last few weeks, or are planned over the next month. These involved close to 200 students participating in activities at the College.	
	> First Nations Students from the Hastings and Prince Edward District School Board visited the College to explore different career pathways and College courses as part of the Next Steps initiative.	
	> Students from the Algonquin, Lakeshore Catholic District School Board and Hastings and Prince Edward District School Board participated in a Junior Journalism daylong session and had the opportunity to learn more about the college and work pathways related to Journalism.

	On May 6th, Media Mashup was held, with students from the Algonquin Lakeshore Catholic District School Board, Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board and Peterborough Victoria Northumberland and Clarington Catholic District School Board having the opportunity to participate in six different media-focused program sessions.	
	> Next week students will participate in a week long Media Camp organized by the Television & New Media Production program. Students will take part in creating a music video and a studio television show and will be taught camera techniques, audio, directing, and much more.	
	➤ Also next week, students will participate in the Loyalist College Animation Camp. Students will take part in five days of intensive instruction in the fundamentals of 3-D animation.	
	➤ The College is once again hosting the Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) program (RYLA) – a week-long leadership and teambuilding workshop Rotary-sponsored program.
