	Chair Werkhoven reported on the following:	
	The Chair commented on the ground-breaking ceremony for the Sustainable Skills, Technology and Life Sciences Centre which was held earlier in the day noting that it was an exciting day for Loyalist, for future students and our communities. Federal and provincial governments were thanked for their financial support enabling the College to make this major project a reality.	
	➤ The Chair represented the Board when the announcement was made at the Hastings Children's Aid Society of the establishment of the Quinte Children's Foundation/Kiwanis Doc Turley Endowment Fund at Loyalist College. The endowment fund will provide an annual award to crown wards and former crown wards of Hastings Children's Aid Society in full time studies at Loyalist. This is a significant donation as the \$37,873 will be matched by the province through the Ontario Trust for Student Support program to create an endowment fund totaling over \$75,000. Foundation Board Chair Bev Townsend also attended the announcement.	
	Governors were reminded of the November 19 <sup>th</sup> Undergraduate Awards Ceremony and invited to attend.	
	Governor Werkhoven commented on her participation at the October 19th Colleges Ontario New Governors Orientation session, which was held at Loyalist, stating that it was an excellent workshop that served as a good refresher for current governors. Governors Kleinschmidt, Van Rooy, and Governor Scott Williams also participated and commented positively on the program.

	President Piercy reported on the following:	
	Maureen added her thanks to Dean Tom Malloy and his staff for accommodating the Board meeting.	
	➤ The President commented on the ground-breaking ceremony for the Sustainable Skills, Technology and Life Sciences Centre noting that construction of the Skills Centre has been part of the College's Master Plan and is key to Loyalist's development in meeting the needs of our students, community and the broader region.	
	Colleges Ontario was host to a College Day Reception, at Queen's Park on Monday, October 26th. Governor Manderville, in her role as a member of Colleges Ontario Governors Advocacy Team, joined members of the Advocacy Team and college presidents (including President Piercy) during the full day of lobbying. Queen's Park politicians were reminded of the contributions of colleges and were asked to recognize the role that college graduates will play in economic recovery.	
	Governor Manderville spoke to her experience at the Colleges Ontario Strategic Week meetings and the College Day one-to-one meetings with MPPs. Although the focus from the MPPs was on the major deficit, Governor Manderville stated that Colleges were assured that funding to Colleges would not be cut.	
	➢ Graduates of Bancroft's 2008 Paramedic program achieved 100 percent success in their Advanced Emergency Medical Care Assistant (AEMCA) exams. The AEMCA is a mandatory provincial examination, required for employment as a Primary Care Paramedic (PCP) in Ontario. This is the fifth year in a row Loyalist grads have achieved 100% success.	
	Loyalist's Contract Training Department was recognized with the non-profit business, large enterprise category award at the annual Belleville/Quinte West Chambers of Commerce Business Achievement Awards ceremony.	
	The November 3rd Open House was a great success attracting more than 1,700 secondary students and teachers from throughout the region.
