	appointment as an External Governor if such individual is a student or an employee of a college of applied arts and technology."

	October 14, 2021  Jennifer May-Anderson provided a report from the October 14, 2021 Academic Committee meeting.	
6	FALL 2021 START UP	
	Senior Vice President, Corporate Services and CFO, Mark Kirkpatrick provided an update on the processes and protocols in place in support of the Fall 2021 start up at the College.	
	On campus protocols include mandatory mask wearing and an internal system for proof of vaccination. The College's mandatory vaccination policy addresses the requirement to be fully vaccinated by November 1, 2021 to be granted access to the campus. The College's Personal Protective App (PPA) or the government issued app along with photo identification will be accepted when requiring entry. The campus will remain closed to guests. On site rapid testing is in until November 1 for those who have not been fully vaccinated. To date, there have been zero positive tests during this process.	

	KEY POINTS/ACTION REQUIRED	FOLLOW-UP RESPONSIBILITY
	The College developed approximately 25 new programs over the last few years, many of which are now being launched despite the ongoing challenges presented by COVID. As the College gradually resumes on-campus operations, Programs of study are being delivered in a variety of ways: face-to-face and on-campus, hybrid which includes a combination of face-to-face and remote, and fully remote (completely online).	
	Several campus projects are moving ahead including the new Health and Wellness Centre, expansion of the A'nó:wara Learning Circle, Maker Space, Culinary Phase 1, Varsity Centre and the Downtown Business Accelerator.
