Loyalist College was established by the Department of Education Act (Ontario) 1967 and is accredited by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (Canada). The College is a member of the Association of Colleges of Applied Arts and Technology of Ontario (ACAATO).

Dean's List	The Dean's List recognizes outstanding academic achievement and is awarded to graduating students from credit-level programs with no subject failures and a program GPA of at least 80%.					
Transfer Credit Information (TC)	The course code and course description will be listed for each course approved for transfer credit. Institution name listed on records from Fall 2013 forward only. 'not available' will be listed prior to this. Notation of Direct Entry will appear here if the student has been granted advanced standing into a higher semester.					

College Grading System and the Weighted Grade Point Average (GPA)

The last line of each semester on the transcript reflects a semester GPA and the Earned Credits (Ecr). Percentage grades are used to describe the achievement level in each course. As part of the GPA calculation, these course grades are weighted by multiplying the credit value (CRED) assigned to each course and the grade achieved (GRD) in each course. To determine the semester GPA, sum all individual semester course CRED x GRD results and divide by the total number of CRED for that semester. The Ecr represents the total of successfully completed course credit values (CRED). An example has been provided below. For simplicity, 3 courses, of which 2 are successful, were taken in a semester.

		CRED	GRD	weighted grades
COMM1000	Communications	2.00	88	2 x 88 = 176

GPA equals the sum of the weighted grades = 639 (176+316+147) divided by the total CRED values =9 (2+4+3) = 71.0%. The Earned Credits (Ecr) = 6 (2+4).

The "Credential Awarded" section will display in the upper left of the transcript. The GPA and Ecr values here only include the courses required to complete the credential and is calculated at the time of graduation (Program GPA). If courses are taken more than once, the best grade is used in the calculation of the GPA. For most programs, a program GPA of 60% is required for graduation. A program GPA of 65% is the minimum requirement for the Applied Degree in Human Services Management, Collaborative Nursing, Practical Nursing, and Personal Support Worker programs. A program GPA of 70% is the minimum requirement for the Paramedic program.

The "Transcript Totals" area displays the institution GPA for all courses taken, regardless of semester or program.

Effective Fall 2014, all courses in each program, with some exceptions, will have a minimum passing grade of 50%. See program manual for exceptions.

Effective Fall 2013, all courses in each program will have a minimum passing grade of 60%.

Effective Fall 2012, years one and two of all programs will have a minimum passing grade of 60% for all courses.

Effective Fall 2011, year one of all programs will have a minimum passing grade of 60% for all courses.

Prior to Fall 2004, the official College grade was a letter grade. Upon introduction of a new Student Information System, these letter grades were converted to a numeric grade value as indicated in the chart below.
