



Congregated History of Skilled Trades in Canada – GNED 1082 Description and Schedule

DESCRIPTION

This course will introduce students to the history of a variety of skilled trades in Canada. Students will learn about the evolution of various trades, necessary employability skills, how training is conducted and certified (if certified), industry trends and requirements, and employment options. Lectures will be augmented with experiential learning so that students can gain a realistic appreciation of the trade, as well as the effects that technological advancements have played in advancing the efficiency and effectiveness of equipment and tools used by the selected trades. Guest speakers will provide students with first-hand insight into their respective professional experiences. Trades intended for exploration during this course include, but are not necessarily limited to: Carpentry, Electrical, Automotive, Manufacturing and Welding. At the conclusion of the course, students will be required to choose one of the skilled trades as their chosen profession and present the rationale in defense of their choice.

**This is both a theory and practical course. Students should be prepared to practice in a variety of skills pathways.
